

# Facilities Built for Learning

## Trade Training Centre and Food Technology

Food technology classes are held in our school kitchens. In addition, we have a Trade Training Centre onsite that provides students wanting to train as chefs, cooks or workers in the hospitality industry access to commercial kitchen facilities.

## Canteen

Located in the McAuley Wing, the Canteen is open each day for students to order lunches and purchase drinks and snacks. Eftpos facilities are available.

## Science

Our dedicated Science classrooms are currently located in the Rice Wing. Year 7 students will attend these rooms for their Science lessons.

## Classrooms

General purpose classrooms are located throughout the College where students attend homeroom and participate in core subjects, such as Maths, English, Humanities, Religion, and Languages.

- Years 11 and 12 students occupy the Rice Wing
- Year 8 and Year 9 students are located in the Tuck Wing
- Year 10 students study in the McAuley Wing, and
- Year 7 students are located in the recently refurbished Mercy Precinct.

## Wellbeing and Learning Diversity

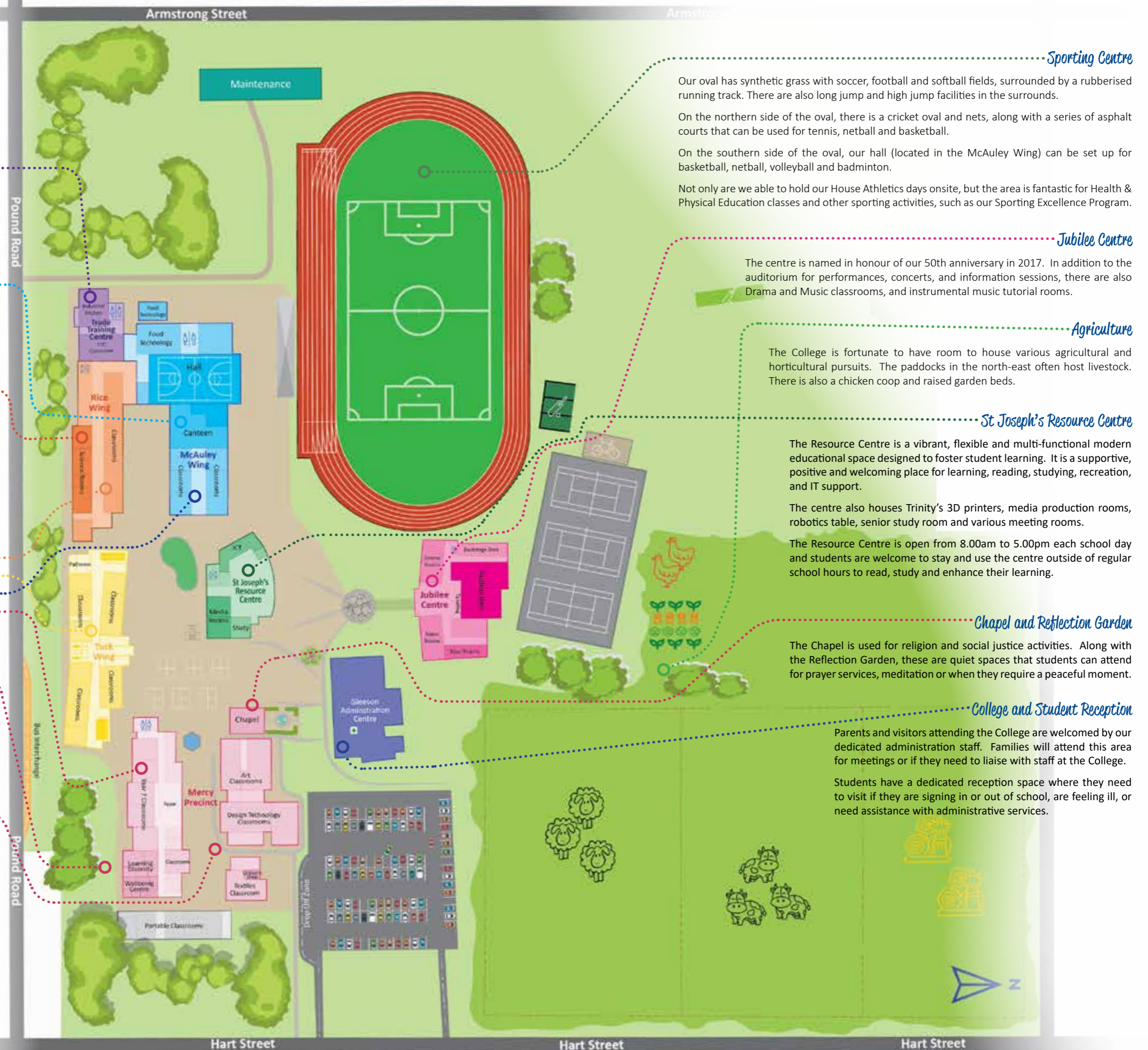
Our Wellbeing and Learning Diversity staff have relocated to a dedicated area at the Hart Street end of the Mercy Precinct. These areas allow students a calming and private space to support our students' wellbeing. Once landscaping is completed, outdoor courtyards will provide an oasis for our students.

## Arts and Design Technology

Located in the Mercy Precinct are our dedicated Art and Graphics rooms, along with purpose built Wood Technology and Textiles classrooms. Bright and vibrant spaces that inspires wonder and creativity for our students.

## Future Senior and STEM Classrooms and Stadium

The next step in our masterplan is the construction of a new wing that will house general-purpose classrooms for senior students, along with new Science, Technology, Engineering, Mathematics (STEM) classrooms. We also envisage replacing our existing hall with a double-court indoor stadium.



## Sporting Centre

Our oval has synthetic grass with soccer, football and softball fields, surrounded by a rubberised running track. There are also long jump and high jump facilities in the surrounds.

On the northern side of the oval, there is a cricket oval and nets, along with a series of asphalt courts that can be used for tennis, netball and basketball.

On the southern side of the oval, our hall (located in the McAuley Wing) can be set up for basketball, netball, volleyball and badminton.

Not only are we able to hold our House Athletics days onsite, but the area is fantastic for Health & Physical Education classes and other sporting activities, such as our Sporting Excellence Program.

## Jubilee Centre

The centre is named in honour of our 50th anniversary in 2017. In addition to the auditorium for performances, concerts, and information sessions, there are also Drama and Music classrooms, and instrumental music tutorial rooms.

## Agriculture

The College is fortunate to have room to house various agricultural and horticultural pursuits. The paddocks in the north-east often host livestock. There is also a chicken coop and raised garden beds.

## St Joseph's Resource Centre

The Resource Centre is a vibrant, flexible and multi-functional modern educational space designed to foster student learning. It is a supportive, positive and welcoming place for learning, reading, studying, recreation, and IT support.

The centre also houses Trinity's 3D printers, media production rooms, robotics table, senior study room and various meeting rooms.

The Resource Centre is open from 8.00am to 5.00pm each school day and students are welcome to stay and use the centre outside of regular school hours to read, study and enhance their learning.

## Chapel and Reflection Garden

The Chapel is used for religion and social justice activities. Along with the Reflection Garden, these are quiet spaces that students can attend for prayer services, meditation or when they require a peaceful moment.

## College and Student Reception

Parents and visitors attending the College are welcomed by our dedicated administration staff. Families will attend this area for meetings or if they need to liaise with staff at the College.

Students have a dedicated reception space where they need to visit if they are signing in or out of school, are feeling ill, or need assistance with administrative services.
